

VICKI DIVOLL continues her career as a national security lawyer and policy advisor, having served on the Hill, in the Intelligence Community, and in academia. Most recently, she has played a role in the public debate on the moral and legal questions surrounding the Obama Administration's program of targeted killing of persons suspected of terrorist affiliations, including the killing of United States citizens. Ms. Divoll taught for six years as a full time adjunct professor at the United States Naval Academy. She completed fellowships at the Stockdale Center for Ethical Leadership at the Academy and at Harvard University's Institute of Politics. Ms. Divoll also served as the general counsel to the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence and as assistant general counsel to the Central Intelligence Agency.

Ms. Divoll's views on issues of national security and intelligence policy have been published in the *New York Times*, *Washington Post* and *Los Angeles Times*, and she has been a guest on CNN, MSNBC, PBS, BBC Radio, BBC World, and several public radio stations. She addressed separation of powers issues in the area of national security in a 2011 article in the *Harvard Journal of Law & Public Policy*, "The 'Full Access Doctrine': Congress's Constitutional Entitlement to National Security Information from the Executive."
